# **DELTA DENTAL**OF KENTUCKY GRANT

A continual blessing has been given to BGFC from the Delta Dental of Kentucky's grant award for \$12,500 for each of the past three years. The charity is working to provide dental work for farms and track employees ranging from extensive cleanings, fillings, extractions to dentures for those who have been living with constant discomfort. To date, the amount of work totals \$7,682 for 13 workers receiving grant funding.



### SNOWY OWL GRANT FUNDING VISION ASSISTANCE

The Snowy Owl Foundation has once again received funding for the charity's eye exams and vision wear program. For 2023, the charity has supplied \$3,495 in exams/glasses and cataract surgery assistance to 12 workers. Advertising in





## BENEVOLENT SERVICES PROVIDED

## Back-to-School Backpack Program 2023:

A HUGE thank you to the Charles R. Jelm Foundation; Country Boy Brewery's 'Keeneland Spring and Fall Meet' initiative with KY Eagle and Keeneland, Inc.; The Junior League of Lexington; and The Honorable Order of Kentucky Colonels providing funding for the needed 2023 backpack order. The charity will distribute 1,156 backpacks in late July/early August so the kids will be ready for the first day of school. Fayette County schools start August 16 — just to give you an idea how time is flying by!



**BY THE NUMBERS:** 

- 47,549 pounds of food provided to farm/track totaling 1,514 people served through food distribution (GP Meal Connect Program) and pantry since January;
  - ◆ \$16,569 paid for Medical/Housing/Utilities/Bereavement assistance since January 1st;
- ◆ 14 Farm and track workers scheduled for dental procedures through the Delta Dental of Kentucky grant;
  - ◆ Vision assistance was given to 11 workers through the Snowy Owl Foundation; including support for cataract surgeries.
  - ◆ Thirteen farm/track children between 10- and 12-years old attending KFW camp;
    - ◆ \$23,119 paid in full to BluSource for the Backpacks.

This year BGFC will give out 196 kindergarten packs, 500 grade school packs, and 400 middle school packs! Farm signups are available and delivery/pick up the first week of August;



In Kentucky, **1 in 8** people are unsure about where they'll get their next meal. In Central and Eastern Kentucky, it is **1 in 6**. Per God's Pantry's Website

## Executive Director's Notes

The dust has settled in most of our lives. What I mean by this is Covid is over, or not as threatening. People are working remote hybrid, which is half time at both home and office. The good news is companies are finding this as a 'cost-saving idea' for offices to turn the lights out half the time and reduce their utility bills. On the flipside, the average family of four is dealing with the utility bills, which has become the main benevolent need this year. The charity calculated a 36% increase for utility assistance from the previous year. Extreme hot and cold months are causing the family to pay triple their normal bill. Electricity and gas are not the only utility to increase. It was reported that "Ky American Water will be increasing their rates by 22%", per Channel 36, WTVQ digital news.

Cost of living expenses are at their highest for everyone, and the charity is doing its part to help the workers and their families who are struggling due to illness, injury, and other specific cases. By relieving their food cost with God's Pantry Meal Connect, weekly distributions to area farms, and in-person pantry requests, BGFC has aided in reducing their financial needs. Our steady outreach has become a welcome relief for the workers on the farms and training facilities.
